
Through the President's Lens

Spring in Texas means wildflowers – in places, wildflowers in profusion. That means it's time to dust off the cameras that have been on the shelf all winter and capture the beauty that is uniquely Texas. Why uniquely? Because of the Bluebonnets, Indian Paintbrush, Fire Wheels and Evening Primrose among others that can be found beside the roads and in the fields. It's a once a year opportunity and one not to be missed.

Bluebonnets are usually in bloom around early to mid-April but they can be earlier or later. Again, Texas decides. I saw Bluebonnets in bloom along Highway 114 in Irving last week and that's really early. The best place to find large fields of Bluebonnets near here is Ennis, Texas. Right now the Ennis Bluebonnet Festival website is estimating the peak of Bluebonnets to be the third week in April. If you haven't been to Ennis it's worth the trip this time of year. April Submissions

The subject for member submissions for the April slideshow is "Shallow Depth of Field." Shallow depth of field (DOF) means the background is out of focus.

Here are some keys to taking photos with a shallow DOF:

- The longer the lens the shallower the DOF (use telephoto not wide angle)
- The closer the focus point the shallower the DOF
- The wider the f-stop the shallower the DOF (f4 has a much shallower DOF than f16)

Shallow DOF is a way to limit or eliminate the distraction of a cluttered background and when used properly enhances the artistic impact of a photograph.

One of the reasons for the monthly subjects is to challenge you as a photographer and to get you to grab your camera and take photos. Because this is part of the challenge, we ask that at least some of the photos you submit have been taken within the last six to twelve months.

Everyone is encouraged to submit up to five photos that meet the subject, "Shallow Depth of Field."

Please, please change the name of the files you submit from the numbers the camera tags the file to a name that is descriptive of the photo. When I'm working with 60 or 70 photos and half of them have only numbers as file identifiers, it gets really confusing.
