Featured Member of the Month

Peggy Thomas



Peggy was born in the Dodge City, Kansas area and grew up on her family's farm. When I asked her how long she's been shooting pictures, she said she can't really remember being without a camera in her hands from her first Brownie! She started shooting the usual subjects, pets, family, friends, and particularly reminisced about when she had a sleepover at the farm. Images of the girls in PJs, sitting on farm equipment specifically came to mind.

Peggy moved to Texas in the late 70's. Her working life encompassed managing a veterinary emergency vet care facility for many years, followed by a stint in insurance. She retired around 2008 and as she was then more able to travel, got quite a bit more serious in her image capture interests. She was a long time Nikon user, and lugged around her D850 and lens collection for quite some time. Seeking some lighter equipment, she then transition to Sony mirror-less equipment, shooting with a range of Sony bodies from a1, a4 and a9 up to current mirror-less options. Other than candid or travel "street" shots, she finds she is less comfortable shooting people than her usual subject attractions of wildlife, landscapes, travel story content, along with some close up and macro work. In the past 12 months she has been in South Africa and also India!
