Featured Member of the Month

Clay Hodson, Vice President



Clay Hodson was born and raised in Southern California. He had a very successful career in law enforcement which lasted 38 years. He worked for both the Whittier Police Department and Riverside County District Attorney's Bureau of Investigation. He retired as the Chief of Investigators in 2007. It was at Whittier PD where Clay first learned to use a film camera. It was mostly surveillance pictures of suspects while he worked Vice and Narcotics.

He also worked as a part-time faculty member at Riverside Community College, teaching criminal justice courses. In his advanced criminal investigation course he taught crime scene photography. Early on he dabbled in film photography with a Pentax ME Super. After retiring from Law Enforcement, he bought a Nikon D60 Kit and enrolled in a "Introduction to Digital Photography" class at the local community college. He learned the basics of digital photography and Photoshop. Since then, he has traded-up his Nikon cameras to a D90, D610, D810, and now a D850.

While living in California he was a member of the Redlands Camera Club. This is where he learned to be thick-skinned and listen to the judge's comments during competition. He has learned a lot from judges. He moved to Texas in 2020 and joined the Robson Ranch Photo Club. He is the editor of the Photogram and the current Vice-President. He enjoys landscape, macro, wildlife, and photographing people. He has traveled to Alaska many times where he enjoys taking pictures of bears and other wildlife. He grew up as an outdoorsman and hunter, but today, he prefers hunting with his camera.
