Workshop BASIC EDITING June 25 7 PM room 104 CATC

The Photography club workshop on June 25 will be focused on editing images <u>WITH SOFTWARE THAT YOU LIKELY ALREADY HAVE</u>. Editing images is as old as photography itself and is essential to getting better results.

The program will start with two live demonstrations. One will use software that is on Windows computers, the other will use software that is on MAC computers. Following the demonstrations, we will have breakout tables for each operating system.

Both demonstrations will cover basic editing and will include the following topics:

Cropping and straitening, brightness and contrast, color and saturation and spot removal.

At the breakout tables, club members have volunteered to serve as guides to help you on a more personal level. If you have specific questions, bring your images on a USB stick. If you need help getting images out of your camera, bring the camera. If you have editing software on a laptop, bring the laptop also.

The CATC will soon have doors that cannot be opened without an app on your phone or a key fob. <u>This happens August 5, 2024</u> so if you haven't already, get your paperwork filled out and submitted. It can be turned into the HOA front desk or given to Jerry.

Everyone meet Frank Barnhart. Frank has been enjoying photography as a hobby for over fifty years. He was introduced to photography by his father, who also shared his passion for the hobby. Franks's father taught him how to develop B&W film and make prints in the basement darkroom using a Beseler enlarger. Attempts at dodging and burning were more experimental rather than productive! Early cameras used were a Kodak Brownie and later a Kodak Instamatic with flashcubes. Seeing a continued interest in the hobby, Frank's dad gave him a used Nikon SLR with a 50mm lens. That camera and lens combination lasted many years. Frank then purchased a Pentax SLR with a normal range zoom lens. He now uses a mirrorless Canon R5 with enough lenses to cover most focal length and lighting needs. Main photographic interests are landscape and travel. Abstracts and architecture are also of high interest. Frank typically shoots in RAW format and processes the images in Lightroom and Photoshop. Prior to moving to Robson Ranch, Frank lived in Boise, Idaho and remains an active member in the Boise Camera Club. In addition to being a member of the Robson Ranch Photography Club, he is also a new member of the Plano Photography Club.
